PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - WEEK 10 HONOREES

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - CHANDLER BURKS, KENNESAW STATE, QB, R-Jr (DOUGLASVILLE, GA.)

Burks directed the Owls to a 16-14 win in snowy conditions at Montana State with 149 rushing yards and a touchdown. He opened the game's scoring with a 2-yard TD run that capped a 17-play, 89-yard drive. With Kennesaw State trailing 14-13 in the fourth quarter, Burks led the Owls -- from their own 2-yard line -- on a 20-play, 78-yard drive that took 10:03 off the clock and set-up the go-ahead field goal. He accounted for 46 yards during the drive (19 rush, 27 pass) and finished the game with 204 yards of offense.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - ANTHONY ELLIS, CHARLESTON SOUTHERN, DL, Sr (APOPKA, FLA.)

Ellis had 12 total tackles (seven solo, five assisted) plus a Big South single-game record 5.5 tackles-for-loss with 2.5 sacks and four quarterback hurries in CSU's 10-9 win at Gardner-Webb. He posted nine stops, 4.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks in the first half as the Bucs limited GWU to 85 yards in the opening 30 minutes.

Co-SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - TYLER TEKAC, CHARLESTON SOUTHERN & JUSTIN THOMPSON, KENNESAW STATE

Tekac booted the game-winning 43-yard field goal as time expired to lift Charleston Southern to a 10-9 victory at Gardner-Webb. With one second remaining, the Bucs' special teams unit got the snap off in time and Tekac's kick extended CSU's Big South record for consecutive conference road wins.

Thompson handled the snowy elements at Montana State as he made all three field goal attempts and finished with 10 points -- including the go-ahead 37-yard field goal with 1:55 remaining in the game. He was successful from 35, 40 and 37 yards and led the Owls' back from a 14-10 deficit with two second-half field goals.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - PETE GUERRIERO, MONMOUTH, RB, R-Fr (LYNDHURST, N.J.)

Guerrero led all players with 172 all-purpose yards, including 153 rushing, in Monmouth's 42-21 win over Presbyterian. He averaged 7.3 yards per carry and scored from eight yards out for the game's final margin.

ESPN3 GOING WILD FOR BIG SOUTH - NOV. 18 WILDCARD SELECTION IS MU AT KSU

ESPN3's Big South Wildcard telecast selection for the regular-season finale on Nov. 18 will be the Monmouth at Kennesaw State affair at 2:00pm from Fifth Third Bank Stadium. **MIKE HOGWOOD** (play-by-play) and **JAY SONNHALTER** (analyst) will have the call of what could determine an outright conference champion and the Big South's automatic bid to recipient to the FCS Playoffs.

SPEAKING OF CHAMPIONSHIPS...

Kennesaw State and Monmouth are tied for first-place in the Big South standings at 3-0. One scenario for clinching at least a share of the regular-season title exists this weekend -- a Kennesaw State victory AND a Monmouth loss; OR a Monmouth victory AND a Kennesaw State loss. The teams meet in the regular-season finale on Nov. 18.

CRAZY EIGHTS

For the fifth time in six seasons, two Big South football members have won eight games in the same year, as Kennesaw State and Monmouth each have eight victories in 2017. KSU is the first Big South member to have back-to-back 8-win seasons since Charleston Southern (2013-15) and Coastal Carolina (2012-15). Monmouth has reached the 8-win plateau for the first time since 2006 and the fourth time overall.

IN FRONT OF THE EIGHT-BALL

Kennesaw State has won a program-record eight consecutive games, which is tied for the third-longest single-season win streak in Big South history. It is also the fifth-longest overall win streak in league annals. The last member to win at least eight games in succession was Charleston Southern in 2015, while the last to win nine-straight in a campaign was Coastal Carolina in 2013.

ELLIS TACKLES BIG SOUTH RECORD FOR TFL, HAS EYE ON LEAGUE'S CAREER SACK TOTAL

Charleston Southern DL **ANTHONY ELLIS** recorded a Big South single-game record 5.5 tackles-for-loss this past Saturday at Gardner-Webb. He bested the old mark of 5.0, which was accomplished seven times and last by Kennesaw State's **TONARIUS PORTRESS** in 2016. Ellis' 5.5 TFL included 2.5 sacks, which pushed him atop the conference with 8.0 this season to become just the second Big South player with three 7.0-sack seasons. He now has 23.0 career quarterback sacks to rank second all-time in Big South history and just two away from tying the career mark of 25.0 held by Liberty's **CHIMA UZOWIHE**.

OWL BE WATCHING

Kennesaw State has held its last three opponents to less than 300 yards of offense and an average of just 257.0 in that span. The Owls lead the Big South in total defense at 283.6, which is pacing ahead of the single-season league record of 292.0 set by Charleston Southern in 2015. The last Big South member to limit four consecutive foes to less than 300 offensive yards was Monmouth (Nov. 14, 2015 - Sept. 10, 2016), while the last to achieve the feat in a season was CSU during its record-setting defensive effort of 2015.

MONUMENTAL

Monmouth is nationally-ranked for the first time in program history, as the Hawks debuted at No. 24 in the FCS Coaches Poll in Week 10 and is No. 22 in the poll this week. The squad is 8-1 for the first time since opening the 2006 campaign at 10-1, and has scored 30 points in seven of its eight victories this season -- a program record. The conference record for most 30-point games in a season is 13 established by Coastal Carolina in 2014.

MAGIC MIKE

Monmouth DB and Buck Buchanan Award candidate **MIKE BASILE** became just the fourth Big South player in history with 400 career tackles when he eclipsed the milestone this past Saturday. He is now third all-time in league annals with 403 stops, and 38 away from second-place. Basile, who is the Big South's all-time leader for career solo tackles with 267, is three tackles shy of becoming just the third player with three 100-tackle seasons. Meanwhile, Basile is second in league history with six career blocked kicks. The all-time record is nine, which is held by Presbyterian College's and three-time NFL Pro Bowler **JUSTIN BETHEL**.

BIG SOUTH SCORES ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL NON-CONFERENCE SEASON

The Big South is one of three conferences (CAA, Southland) with two 1-loss teams, and is 16-11 (=59.3 percent) against non-conference FCS opponents in 2017, marking the league's fifth consecutive winning regular-season against non-league foes. Since the start of the 2013 campaign, the Big South is 80-43 (=65.0 winning percentage) in regular-season competition and 85-49 (=63.4) when including postseason games in that span.

BIRDS OF PREY

Kennesaw State and Monmouth rank 12th and 14th, respectively, in the nation in rushing defense. The Owls are permitting 94.7 rushing yards per game and have held four foes to less than 100 yards on the ground. The Hawks have allowed an average of 102.0 rushing yards per game. The Big South single-season record for rushing defense is 101.0 yards per game set by Stony Brook in 2011.

BIG SOUTH LANDS THREE ON NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

The Big South has three of the 17 candidates on the STATS Jerry Rice Award Watch List, as Kennesaw State LB **BRYSON ARMSTRONG**, Monmouth RB **PETE GUERRIERO** and Presbyterian College RB **TORRANCE MARABLE** were among the initial honorees. It is the second consecutive year that the league has three candidates for the nation's top freshman in the same season.

KENNESAW STATE EXTENDS BIG SOUTH RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE 300-YARD RUSH GAMES

The Kennesaw State Owls have rushed for 300 yards in a Big South-record six consecutive games. KSU has rushed for 2,128 yards in that span (354.7 average), including a conference-game record 498 in Week 7 at Liberty. The Owls lead the nation in rushing yards per game with 331.2 -- the second-highest single-season average in league history.

BURKS BREAKS THROUGH

Kennesaw State QB **CHANDLER BURKS** has scored a rushing TD in six consecutive games, tied for the second-longest streak by a quarterback in league history and one away from matching the record of seven set by Charleston Southern's **COLLIN DRAFTS** from 2005-06. Burks notched his fourth career 3-TD rush game in Week 9 at Presbyterian, the most by a Big South quarterback in the conference record book and tied for the third-most overall in league annals.

ELLIS ISLAND

With 23.0 career sacks and 48.0 career TFL, Charleston Southern DL, Buck Buchanan Award candidate and Big South Preseason Defensive Player of the Year **ANTHONY ELLIS** is on the verge of becoming the Big South's first-ever 25/50 player. He is second all-time in both categories, trailing just Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** on the TFL chart (53.5) and Liberty's **CHIMA UZOWIHE** on the sack list (25.0). Ellis can join Johnston as the only players with 20.0 sacks and 50.0 TFL.

BUCS EXTEND RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE BIG SOUTH ROAD WINS

Charleston Southern extended its Big South-record for consecutive league road wins to nine with a thrilling, last-second 10-9 victory at Gardner-Webb this past Saturday. The Bucs broke the old mark of seven in their Big South opener in Week 7 with a 7-0 win at Presbyterian. CSU's current streak began Nov. 1, 2014, and puts the streak on the line this Saturday at Kennesaw State.

STRETCH ARMSTRONG

Kennesaw State R-freshman LB **BRYSON ARMSTRONG** has tied the Big South freshman record for quarterback sacks with 7.0. He joins Gardner-Webb's **PRESTON PEMASA** (2010) and Charleston Southern LB **SOLOMON BROWN** (2015) in the club, and has at least two games remaining to establish a new total. Armstrong, who has been the STATS National Freshman of the Week (Week 3) and three-time Honorable Mention for the weekly award (Weeks 1, 2 & 6), ranks second in the league in sacks, and also ranks among the Big South leaders in fumble recoveries (1st), tackles per game (4th), TFL (T-6th), interceptions (T-4th) and passes defended (T-65th).

IF THE SCHU FITS

Gardner-Webb senior kicker **PAUL SCHUMACHER** became the ninth kicker in Big South history with 30 career field goals when he reached the milestone in Week 7 at N.C. Central. Schumacher, who is the third GWU kicker on the league's all-time list, is now tied for seventh-place with 35, and needs five to become the sixth Big South kicker with 40.

WHITEBOARD

Monmouth R-junior WR **REGGIE WHITE JR.** caught 10 passes for 187 yards and two scores in Week 8 vs. Liberty. It was his fifth career 10-reception game, the second-most in Big South history. The career record is eight, held by Charleston Southern's **MAURICE PRICE**.

TRY TO KEEP UP WITH THIS JONES

Monmouth junior RB **DEVELL JONES** is second in the Big South with 10 rushing touchdowns. The short-yardage specialist has carried the ball a total of 45 times for 195 yards -- with a long of 42 -- and has scored on runs of 6, 6, 8, 4, 1, 3, 4, 4, 1 and 2 yards for the Hawks. Jones, who is just the eighth Big South player to score a rushing TD in the first five games of a season, is the first Monmouth player to score 10 rushing touchdowns since MU joined the Big South in 2014.

The Big South's exclusive seven-game TV package on ESPN3 continues this Saturday with Charleston Southern at Kennesaw State live from Fifth Third Bank Stadium at 3:30pm. **MIKE HOGEWOOD** (play-by-play) and **JAY SONNHALTER** (analyst) have the call from Kennesaw. ESPN3 is carrying a Big South game each week the remainder of the season, including a "Wildcard" selection the final week which will be the Monmouth-Kennesaw State match-up.

BIG SOUTH COVERAGE ON STADIUM NETWORK CONCLUDES SATURDAY

Big South football on the new Stadium Network concludes this Saturday, Nov. 11 with the Gardner-Webb at Monmouth contest live at 12:00pm. **MATT HARMON** (play-by-play) and **TODDERICK HUNT** (analyst) have the call from Kessler Stadium. The Big South will have appeared on Stadium three times this season.

BIG SOUTH DEBUTS ON "COLLEGE FOOTBALL DOWN SOUTH"

A new partnership this season with **7COMM/PRINCETON MEDIA GROUP** features four Big South football broadcasts on a new regional network of broadcast TV stations called "*College Football Down South*." The next broadcast is Saturday's Presbyterian at Liberty contest. **MARK BRYANT** (play-by-play) and **MILES HUNTER** (analyst) have the call from Lynchburg. The final broadcast is the Nov. 18 Liberty at Charleston Southern game.

TV GUIDE

The Big South Conference's 2017 television slate features 45 games spanning every week of the campaign -- nearly 90 percent of the entire schedule -- with 14 total games exclusively on **ESPN3**, **STADIUM** and **7COMM/PRINCETON MEDIA GROUP**.

CALL IN THE CALVERTY

Liberty sophomore QB **STEPHEN CALVERT** leads the Big South with 2,797 passing yards and 24 TDs. His 310.8 passing yards per game is pacing way ahead of the league record of 274.7 (Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006), and is on track for 3,419 yards, which is ahead of the Big South single-season record of 3,389. Calvert could also become the first QB in conference annals to throw 30 touchdown passes in a season, as he is six away with two games to play. He has tossed a TD pass in 11 consecutive games dating back to last season -- tied for the fifth-longest streak in Big South history. Meanwhile, Calvert has two 400-yard passing games to his credit this year -- the first Big South player to achieve this feat in a campaign.

THREE-LEGGED RACE

Kennesaw State QB **CHANDLER BURKS** became the 10th quarterback in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 3. He was the third player in Kennesaw State's young history to reach the benchmark, and is now the program's all-time leader with 1,552 -- ahead of former teammates **CHASTON BENNETT** (1,321) and **TREY WHITE** (1,059). RBs **JAKE MCKENZIE** (1,330) and **DARNELL HOLLAND** (1,149) surpassed the milestone in Week 7 at Liberty to give the Owls three active players with 1,000 career rushing yards.

TORRANCE THE TERRIFIC

Presbyterian College freshman RB **TORRANCE MARABLE** is the first Big South freshman ever to score a touchdown in five consecutive games, as he tallied five (three rushing, two receiving) during Weeks 2-6. While Marable is fifth in the Big South with 726 rushing yards -- just 42 yards off the lead -- he is challenging to become the first Blue Hose player and just the second Big South frosh to lead the conference in rushing.

KING OF THE HILL

Liberty junior WR **DAMIAN KING** has caught 58 passes for 607 yards through nine games. In his first two years in Lynchburg, he had 24 career receptions for 206 yards in 16 appearances. King already has two 10-reception games in 2017, the first Liberty player with this achievement since **DARRIN PETERSON** in 2014.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 142. Monmouth holds the second-longest active streak at 34 games, just ahead of Kennesaw State's streak of 31 games.

MAXWELL HOUSE

Gardner-Webb QB, Walter Payton Award candidate and Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year **TYRELL MAXWELL** is the first Big South QB in league history with 20 career rushing touchdowns and 20 career passing TDs. He broke the quarterback record of 19 rushing TDs with two scores at N.C. Central in Week 7 to give him 20. Maxwell has thrown 22 career scoring strikes.

RANK AND FILE

The Big South returned to the national rankings Oct. 30 following a four-week hiatus, and re-entered the Top 25 with two programs in the FCS Coaches poll. This week, Monmouth is No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll while Kennesaw State is at No. 23. It is the fourth time this season two Big South teams were nationally-ranked in the same week, and the 42nd time overall in Big South history. Kennesaw State is at No. 23 in the STATS FCS poll, while the Hawks are in the 27th position of that ranking. The Big South's streak of 83 consecutive weeks with a nationally-ranked football member ended Oct. 2 entering Week 6, which marked the first time the Big South was outside the two major Top 25 polls since Week 8 of the 2011 season (Oct. 17).

REG-GIE, REG-GIE

Monmouth junior WR **REGGIE WHITE JR.** has posted back-to-back seasons with 60+ receptions -- the first Big South player to achieve this feat since Liberty's **DARRIN PETERSON** in 2014-15 and the seventh overall in league history. Last season's Big South leader in receptions, receptions per game and receiving yards, White entered the Big South's career Top 10 for receptions this past Saturday, and is now ninth all-time with 164 -- three away from moving into the eighth spot. His 2,106 career receiving yards is just two shy of the Top 10, and he needs two TDs to become the 10th Big South player with 20.

2,000-YARD RUSHING ODYSSEY

Gardner-Webb QB **TYRELL MAXWELL** is the Big South's active career rushing leader with 2,746 -- the only signal-caller in conference annals above the 2,000-yard threshold. That effort is good for seventh all-time in league history and 115 away from moving into sixth-place. He needs 254 rushing yards to become just the sixth player with 3,000 in a career. Maxwell led the Big South in rushing in 2016 with 965 yards -- the first quarterback in league history to finish as the conference's leading rusher -- and is currently third this year with 732.

BANK ON BURKS

Kennesaw State QB **CHANDLER BURKS** is the second Big South quarterback with 10 rushing touchdowns in a season, as he currently leads the league with 11. The conference single-season record for TD rushes by a signal-caller is 12, set by VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** in 2008. Burks is tied with Gardner-Webb's **TYRELL MAXWELL** for first all-time among quarterbacks in Big South history with 20 career rushing scores. Meanwhile, Burks ranks fifth on the Big South's quarterback career rushing list with 1,552 yards, and needs 13 to move into fourth-place.

GANDY DANCER

Liberty WR **ANTONIO GANDY-GOLDEN** has caught 59 passes for a league-best 953 yards and eight TDs in nine games this season. In 11 games as a freshman in 2016, he had 21 catches for 315 yards and three scores. Gandy-Golden has five 100-yard receiving games -- including two with at least 170 receiving yards to be the first Big South receiver with this distinction since former Flame WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** in 2011. Meanwhile, Gandy-Golden's 105.9 receiving yards per game just trails Summers' league record of 108.1. Gandy-Golden is on pace for 1,165 receiving yards, which would be the third-highest single-season total in Big South annals.

50-50 RAFFLES

Liberty receiving tandem **ANTONIO GANDY-GOLDEN** (59) and **DAMIAN KING** (58) are on the cusp of becoming the first teammates in history to have 60 receptions in the same season. They are already the first pair of Big South teammates with 50 receptions in the same year since 2014 and the seventh overall. It is the third time Liberty has achieved this accomplishment, the most by any school. In Week 1 at Baylor, King and Gandy-Golden became the first Big South teammates ever with at least 10 catches in the same game. Gandy-Golden posted career-highs of 13 receptions for 192 yards against the Bears, while King caught 10 balls for 66 yards.

KENYATTA WILL GET-YA

Gardner-Webb senior LB **KENYATTA DUNBAR** leads the Big South with 1.5 TFL per game and 13.5 total tackles-for-loss. He posted a TFL in five consecutive games -- including three straight with at least 3.0 TFL during Weeks 2-4 (10.0 total) to be the first Big South player to record three-straight 3.0+ TFL games since Gardner-Webb All-American DL **HAROLD WELLS** in 2004. Wells posted 10.5 tackles-for-loss during his streak (4.5, 3.0, 3.0). Dunbar entered the season with just 1.5 career stops behind the line.

BIG BROWN

Charleston Southern junior LB **SOLOMON BROWN** shares the Big South record for most career quarterback sacks by a linebacker with 14.0, a record first set by Coastal Carolina's **MAURICE SIMPKINS** (2003-05). Brown became the 18th member of the league's 30.0 TFL club in Week 8, and sits at 34.0 through 31 career appearances.

KAMERON KAN

Charleston Southern R-sophomore WR **KAMERON BROWN** connected with R-sophomore QB **SHANE BUCENELL** on an 87-yard touchdown pass against Mississippi Valley State in Week 5, tied for the fourth-longest pass play in Big South history. In 19 career games, Brown has caught 47 career passes for 974 yards -- a 20.72 career yards per catch average -- and eight scores.

RUSH WEEK

Monmouth freshman running back tandem **ERIC ZOKOURI** and **PETE GUERRIERO** combined for 355 rushing yards against Liberty in Week 8. Zokouri gained a team-high 193 yards with two TDs on 18 carries, while Guerriero tallied 162 and a score on 18 attempts. It was the fourth-highest combined rushing total in a Big South game and the seventh-highest overall total. Zokouri and Guerriero are the first Big South teammates to each rush for more than 150 yards in the same game since Stony Brook's **MIGUEL MAYSONET** (182) and **BROCK JACKOLSKI** (174) against Charleston Southern on Nov. 5, 2011.

HIGH FIVE

Liberty sophomore QB **STEPHEN CALVERT** is the first Big South quarterback in league history with two 5-TD pass games in the same season. He has tied the conference single-game record twice this year -- first in Week 2 and again in Week 8 with five scoring strikes at Monmouth. Calvert, who is the first Big South quarterback in league history to open the season with three consecutive 3-TD pass games, as well as the second overall to throw at least three scoring strikes in back-to-back-to-back games, now shares the career record of most 5-TD pass games (2) with former Charleston Southern QB **COLLIN DRAFTS**.

COVER 2

Monmouth R-senior DB **TEDDIE MARTINEZ** is tied for the Big South lead with five interceptions, and posted his second multi-interception game this season with two picks at Bucknell in Week 5. He now has nine career interceptions during his time in the Big South and is one pick shy of becoming the 11th Big South player with 10 career INTs.

MAD MAX

Gardner-Webb QB **TYRELL MAXWELL** posted his 10th career game with 100 yards rushing and 100 yards passing in Week 7 at N.C. Central to extend his Big South career record. He finished with 165 yards on the ground and 138 through the air against the Eagles. It was Maxwell's 11th career 100-yard rushing game -- the eighth-most by any Big South player.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN, KENNESAW STATE TIE FOR TOP PRESEASON SPOT

For the first time, two teams finished as the favorite in the annual Big South preseason football poll, as two-time defending conference champion Charleston Southern University and third-year program Kennesaw State University claimed the top spot in the 2017 preseason rankings as voted by the league's head coaches and media panel. Both teams received nine first-place votes, eight second-place votes and one third-place vote to finish atop the poll with 80 points each. The Owls will host the Buccaneers on Saturday, Nov. 11.

COULD THIS BE A REASON WHY THE PRESEASON POLL HAD TIED TEAMS?

Charleston Southern and Liberty shared the Big South football championship in 2016 with 4-1 league records. It was the sixth time in eight seasons that the conference had co-champions in football, and the eighth time overall in the league's 15-year football history that multiple champions were crowned in a season. In 2016, CSU earned its third overall title (two shared), while Liberty took home its Big South-record eighth overall football trophy (six shared).

BIG SOUTH COLLECTS FIRST-EVER WIN OVER POWER 5 MEMBER

The Big South scored its sixth win over an FBS opponent with Liberty's 48-45 triumph over Big 12 member Baylor in Week 1. It was the conference's first-ever win over a Power 5 member, as well as the league's first FBS victory in a season-opener. The Big South's six FBS wins have all come since 2010.

CALVERT GETS BIG SOUTH PASSING RECORD TRIFECTA IN BAYLOR WIN

Liberty sophomore QB **STEPHEN CALVERT** set three Big South single-game passing records during the Flames' Week 1 win at Baylor. He established new marks for completions (44), attempts (60) and yardage (447) against the Bears. Calvert's effort bested the previous records of 37 completions (Presbyterian's **TIM WEBB** at Wofford in 2008), 57 attempts (Webb at Appalachian State in 2008) and 430 yards (Gardner-Webb's **LUCAS BEATTY** at VMI in 2014). Calvert's 447 yards of offense at Baylor is the fourth-most in a game in Big South history.
