PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - WEEK 6 HONOREES

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - KENJI BAHAR, MONMOUTH, QB, R-SOPH (BALTIMORE, Md.)

Bahar posted career-highs of 324 passing yards and three touchdowns in leading the Hawks to a 48-36 win at Holy Cross. He was 23-of-31 passing (=74.2 percent) with no interceptions and finished with a 193.92 pass efficiency rating on the afternoon. Bahar connected with seven different receivers, unleashed a 61-yarder and 43-yarder, and threw TDs of four, three and 13 yards.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - MIKE BASILE, MONMOUTH, DB, Sr (BRICK, N.J.)

Basile set the Big South single-game record with 17 solo tackles and finished with a career-high 19 stops at Holy Cross, in addition to four tackles-for-loss -- two of which were sacks, and a forced fumble. His second quarter sack-fumble led to Monmouth's first touchdown of the day. Basile became the Big South's all-time leader in career solo tackles during the game.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK - PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE SPECIAL TEAMS

PC's Special Teams Unit accounted for 14 points in the Blue Hose's 26-14 win over St. Francis (Pa.). KJ Presley blocked a 30-yard field goal in the first quarter to keep SFU off the scoreboard, followed by a team safety on a Red Flash punt attempt early in the second quarter. Later in the second stanza, Rod Haygood blocked a punt that Malachi Brown returned 17 yards for a touchdown to give PC a 12-0 lead. Kicker/punter Brett Norton converted six points and placed three of his six punts inside the 20-yard line.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK - TORRANCE MARABLE, PRESBYTERIAN, RB, Fr (DECATUR, GA.)

Marable rushed for 86 yards and a touchdown in PC's victory over St. Francis. With PC ahead by five points in the fourth quarter, he scored from 12 yards out with 4:01 remaining to put the game out of reach. Marable gained 37 of his 86 yards in the final quarter.

TIS THE SEASON -- CONFERENCE SEASON!!

Big South action begins this Saturday with two league games -- Charleston Southern at Presbyterian and Kennesaw State at Liberty. Gardner-Webb and Monmouth open their respective league slates next week. Below is a breakdown of how each squad has fared in its respective conference openers:

EXTRA POINTS

Charleston Southern and Gardner-Webb are seeking their third consecutive 1-0 start to the Big South season. Kennesaw State last started 1-0 in league play in 2015, while Monmouth is looking to win its Big South opener for the first time since joining the conference in 2014. Liberty opened 1-0 last season, and PC's last 1-0 Big South start was in 2013.

BUCS HAVE EYE ON RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE BIG SOUTH ROAD WINS

Charleston Southern opens Big South play Saturday at Presbyterian, and carries a seven-game win streak in conference road games into Clinton. The streak is tied for the longest in league history that was first accomplished by Liberty from Nov. 18, 2006 to Nov. 14, 2009.

MONUMENTAL

Monmouth is a league-best 5-1, and have scored 30 points in all five victories. The last time the Hawks posted five 30-point games was in 2008 -- which was also the last time MU scored 30 points in five wins. The conference record for most 30-point games in a season is 13 established by Coastal Carolina in 2014.

COMING FULL CIRCLE

Liberty begins its final run through the Big South schedule this weekend. The Flames are the league's all-time winningest program in conference action, as Liberty is 53-20 all-time in Big South contests (=72.6 percent). Gardner-Webb and Charleston Southern are tied for third with 34 league victories. Meanwhile, the Flames have scored a point in all 73 of its Big South games, the longest such streak in league annals. Of those 73 games, the last 61 have been in double digits. Charleston Southern's current streak of 47 conference games with a point scored is the third-longest all-time.

BLOCK PARTY

Presbyterian blocked two kicks this past Saturday in its win over St. Francis (Pa.), the squad's first multi-block game since 2009. **KJ PRESLEY** blocked a 30-yard field goal attempt, followed by **ROD HAYGOOD's** blocked punt that **MALACHI BROWN** returned 17 yards for a touchdown. It was the league's first blocked punt TD return since 2014 when Charleston Southern's **LARENZO MATHIS** achieved the feat at Vanderbilt. It was PC's first such occurrence since 2011 when **JUSTIN BETHEL** did it twice that season.

DUMAS DOES MORE

Monmouth DB **KAMAU DUMAS** returned a punt 89 yards for a touchdown this past Saturday at Holy Cross -- the second-longest punt return in Big South history. He later intercepted a pass and returned it 39 yards for a score to become the just the second player in the conference record book with a punt return TD and pick-six in the same game. Presbyterian College's **JUSTIN BETHEL** was the first in 2011, when he returned a blocked punt and interception for scores at California on Sept. 17.

TORRANCE THE TERRIFIC

Presbyterian College freshman RB **TORRANCE MARABLE** is the first Big South freshman ever to score a touchdown in five consecutive games, as he has tallied a team-leading five in that span (three rushing, two receiving) since Sept. 9. Marable leads the Big South with 564 rushing yards and 94.0 rushing yards per game. He is looking to become the first Blue Hose player and just the second Big South frosh to lead the conference in rushing yards. Marable is on pace for 1,034 rushing yards this season, which would be the second-most by a Big South freshman in league history behind Stony Brook's **EDWIN GOWINS'** freshman record of 1,310 in 2008.

MAGIC MIKE

Monmouth DB and Buck Buchanan Award candidate **MIKE BASILE** is the Big South's all-time leader for career solo tackles with 244, as he broke the record of 243 this past Saturday with a Big South single-game record 17 solo hits at Holy Cross. Basile's 375 career total stops are fourth-most in the Big South record book, and 25 away from becoming just the fourth Big South player with 400 career tackles. Meanwhile, Basile is tied for second in league history with five career blocked kicks. The all-time record is nine, which is held by Presbyterian College's and three-time NFL Pro Bowler **JUSTIN BETHEL**.

BIRDS OF PREY

Kennesaw State and Monmouth rank sixth and 11th, respectively, in the nation in rushing defense. The Owls are permitting just 64.0 rushing yards per game and have held four foes to less than 100 yards on the ground -- tied for the fourth-most times in league history. The Hawks have allowed an average of 82.8 rushing yards per game. The Big South single-season record for rushing defense is 101.0 yards per game set by Stony Brook in 2011.

BURKS BREAKS THROUGH

Kennesaw State QB **CHANDLER BURKS** scored three rushing touchdowns this past Saturday vs. Texas Southern, his third career 3-TD rushing game -- tied for the most by a Big South quarterback in league history. Former teammate **TREY WHITE** was the first to achieve this feat three times.

BIG BEN

Presbyterian College R-junior QB **BEN CHEEK** already has set career-highs in a season for rushing yards (255) and passing TDs (4), and is approaching his personal-best for season passing yards. With 635, he is 202 away from his current-high of 837 set last year. Cheek's 57.8 completion percentage and 125.0 efficiency rating this year are already ahead of his previous highs.

KENYATTA WILL GET-YA

Gardner-Webb senior LB **KENYATTA DUNBAR** is second in the FCS with 2.2 TFL per game and 11.0 total tackles-for-loss (all solo). He posted three consecutive games with at least 3.0 TFL during Weeks 2-4 (10.0 total) -- the first Big South player to record three-straight 3.0+ TFL games since Gardner-Webb All-American DL **HAROLD WELLS** in 2004. Wells posted 10.5 tackles-for-loss during his streak (4.5, 3.0, 3.0). Dunbar entered the season with just 1.5 career stops behind the line.

STRETCH ARMSTRONG

Kennesaw State R-freshman LB **BRYSON ARMSTRONG** leads the Big South with 6.0 sacks -- just one away from tying the league's freshman record of 7.0 set by Gardner-Webb's **PRESTON PEMASA** in 2010 and tied by Charleston Southern LB **SOLOMON BROWN** in 2015. Armstrong, who has been the STATS National Freshman of the Week (Week 3) and three-time Honorable Mention for the weekly award (Weeks 1, 2 & 6), also ranks in the Big South top five in fumble recoveries (1st), forced fumbles (T-5th), tackles per game (4th), TFL (4th), interceptions (3rd) and passes defended (T-3rd).

ALLS WELLS THAT ENDS WELLS

Liberty junior DL **JUWAN WELLS** has posted a TFL in four of five games this season and in 17 of his 26 career appearances (=65.4 percent). He has 24.0 TFLs in his career with 13.0 sacks.

CALL IN THE CALVERTY

Liberty sophomore QB **STEPHEN CALVERT**, who is the first Big South quarterback in league history to open the season with three consecutive 3-TD pass games, as well as the second overall to throw at least three scoring strikes in back-to-back-to-back games, leads the Big South with 1,611 passing yards and 14 TDs. His 322.2 passing yards per game is pacing way ahead of the league record of 274.7 (Coastal Carolina's **TYLER THIGPEN** in 2006), and is on track for a Big South single-season record 3,544 yards. Calvert is also on pace to become the first QB in conference annals to throw 30 touchdown passes in a season, as he is currently on track for 31. He tied the Big South single-game record with five touchdown passes in Week 2. Meanwhile, Calvert is one TD throw away from becoming the 15th Big South player with 30 in a career.

RUSH HOUR

Charleston Southern's defense held Mississippi Valley State to minus-24 yards rushing on 27 attempts in Week 5, the fewest allowed to a Division I opponent in Big South history and the second-fewest overall in a game. The overall league record is minus-25 yards, set by Gardner-Webb vs. Virginia State in 2011.

BIG SOUTH'S EXCLUSIVE ESPN3 PACKAGE RESUMES SATURDAY

The Big South's exclusive seven-game TV package on ESPN3 resumes this Saturday with Kennesaw State at Liberty live from Williams Stadium at 6:00pm. **PATRICK KINAS** (play-by-play) and **JAY SONNHALTER** (analyst) have the call from Lynchburg. ESPN3 will carry a Big South game each week the remainder of the season, including a "Wildcard" selection the final week of the regular-season. Coverage of that game will be determined 14-21 days in advance.

BIG SOUTH TO MAKE DEBUT ON STADIUM NETWORK THIS SATURDAY

The Big South will make its debut on the new Stadium Network this Saturday with the Charleston Southern at Presbyterian College contest live at 12:00pm. **MIKE HOGWOOD** (play-by-play) and **RENALDO WYNN** (analyst) have the call from Bailey Memorial Stadium. The Big South will appear on Stadium three times this season, which will all be noon kickoffs. The remaining two broadcasts are the Oct. 28 Liberty at Gardner-Webb game and the Nov. 11 Gardner-Webb at Monmouth match-up.

TV GUIDE

The Big South Conference's 2017 television slate features 45 games spanning every week of the campaign -- nearly 90 percent of the entire schedule -- with 14 total games exclusively on **ESPN3**, **STADIUM** and **7COMM/PRINCETON MEDIA GROUP**. 7Comm/Princeton Media Group is a new television partner in 2017, and will produce and air four football broadcasts on a new regional network of broadcast TV stations named "*College Football Down South*." The first 7Comm broadcast is the Oct. 28 Kennesaw State at Presbyterian contest.

RANK AND FILE

The Big South's streak of 83 consecutive weeks with a nationally-ranked football member ended Oct. 2 entering Week 6. It was the first time the Big South was outside the two major Top 25 polls since Week 8 of the 2011 season (Oct. 17). This week, Monmouth sits on the cusp of the FCS Coaches Top 25, as the Hawks landed in the 26th position. MU was also the league's highest vote-getter in this week's STATS FCS poll at No. 33 in that ranking.

GANDY DANCER

Liberty WR **ANTONIO GANDY-GOLDEN** has caught 34 passes for a league-best 549 yards and four TDs in five games this season. In 11 games as a freshman in 2016, he had 21 catches for 315 yards and three scores. Gandy-Golden has three 100-yard receiving games -- including two with at least 170 receiving yards to be the first Big South receiver with this distinction since former Flame WR **CHRIS SUMMERS** in 2011. Meanwhile, Gandy-Golden's 109.8 receiving yards per game is pacing just ahead of Summers' league record of 108.1. Gandy-Golden is on pace for 1,208 receiving yards, which would be the third-highest single-season total in Big South annals.

THREE-LEGGED RACE

Kennesaw State QB **CHANDLER BURKS** became the 10th quarterback in Big South history with 1,000 career rushing yards when he reached the milestone in Week 3 at Alabama State. With 1,174 yards, he is the third player in Kennesaw State's young history to reach the benchmark, behind former teammates **CHASTON BENNETT** (1,321) and **TREY WHITE** (1,059). Meanwhile, KSU RBs **DARNELL HOLLAND** (987) and **JAKE MCKENZIE** (936) are poised to join Burks and give the Owls three active players with 1,000 career rushing yards.

KING OF THE HILL

Liberty junior WR **DAMIAN KING** has caught 35 passes for 336 yards through five games. In his first two years in Lynchburg, he had 24 career receptions for 206 yards in 16 appearances. King already has two 10-reception games in 2017, the first Liberty player with this achievement since **DARRIN PETERSON** in 2014.

HOMEWARD BOUND

Presbyterian College is in the midst of a *SEVEN-GAME* homestand, the longest streak of consecutive home games in Big South history. The Blue Hose will host eight games at Bailey Memorial Stadium this season after the Week 2 PC at The Citadel game was moved to Clinton due to Hurricane Irma. Presbyterian is 3-2 on the current stand, and will remain at home through Saturday, Oct. 21. The Big South's previous longest homestand was four games, which occurred six times and most recently by Gardner-Webb in 2016.

REG-GIE, REG-GIE

Monmouth junior WR **REGGIE WHITE JR.** has 143 career receptions for 1,798 receiving yards with 16 TDs. Last season's Big South leader in receptions, receptions per game and receiving yards, White is 202 receiving yards shy of becoming the 14th Big South player with 2,000 in a career, and seven catches away from 150.

ROMAN EMPIRE

Kennesaw State R-senior **DB KEON ROMAN** became just the second player in Big South history with at least two interceptions in back-to-back games when he picked off two passes in Week 5 against North Greenville after collecting two INTs in the team's previous outing at Alabama State in Week 3. Roman joined former Charleston Southern DB **CHARLES JAMES** as the only Big South players to achieve this feat. James' two consecutive multi-INT games occurred in 2010 (five total).

TRY TO KEEP UP WITH THIS JONES

Monmouth junior RB **DEVELL JONES** leads the Big South and is third nationally with seven rushing touchdowns. The short-yardage specialist has carried the ball a total of 28 times for 133 yards -- with a long of 42 -- and has scored on runs of 6, 6, 8, 4, 1, 3 and 4 yards for the Hawks. Jones is just the eighth Big South player to score a rushing TD in the first five games of a season.

MAXWELL HOUSE

Gardner-Webb QB, Walter Payton Award candidate and Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year **TYRELL MAXWELL** is the Big South's all-time leading rusher among quarterbacks with 2,401 yards -- the only signal-caller above the 2,000-yard threshold. With 18 career rushing scores and 21 career scoring strikes, he is in position to become the first Big South QB with 20 career rushing and passing TDs.

ELLIS ISLAND

Charleston Southern DL, Buck Buchanan Award candidate and Big South Preseason Defensive Player of the Year **ANTHONY ELLIS** is third in Big South history with 18.5 career sacks and 39.5 career TFL. He is looking to become just the third player in the conference record book with 40 tackles-for-loss and 20 sacks. He would join Gardner-Webb's **BRIAN JOHNSTON** (53.5 TFL, 20.5 SK) and Liberty's **CHIMA UZOWIHE** (44.0 TFL, 25.0 SK) in this exclusive club. Ellis is one of two players in Big South history with two 7.0 sack seasons, as well as one of two to lead the conference in tackles-for-loss in consecutive years.

TURNING HEADS

Liberty R-junior DB **CHRIS TURNER** has 26 career passes defended (18 PBU and 8 INT). He is four away from becoming the 12th player in Big South history with 30. Turner has recorded a PD in four of five contests this season, and in 14 of his last 16 games dating back to last season. He is two picks shy of becoming the 11th Big South player with 10 career interceptions.

TED 2

Monmouth R-senior DB **TEDDIE MARTINEZ** posted his second multi-interception game this season with two picks at Bucknell in Week 5, and is tied for the league-lead with four. He now has eight career interceptions during his time in the Big South and is two picks shy of becoming the 11th Big South player with 10 career INTs.

2,000-YARD RUSHING ODYSSEY

Gardner-Webb QB **TYRELL MAXWELL** is the Big South's active career rushing leader with 2,401 -- good for 14th all-time in league history. He needs 56 yards to enter the Top 10 and 599 rushing yards to become just the sixth player with 3,000 in a career. Maxwell led the Big South in rushing in 2016 with 965 yards -- the first quarterback in league history to finish as the conference's leading rusher.

POINT OF ORDER

Liberty owns the Big South record for most consecutive games with a point scored at 138. Monmouth holds the second-longest active streak at 31 games, just ahead of Kennesaw State's streak of 27 games.

KAMERON KAN

Charleston Southern R-sophomore WR **KAMERON BROWN** connected with R-sophomore QB **SHANE BUCENELL** on an 87-yard touchdown pass against Mississippi Valley State in Week 5, tied for the fourth-longest pass play in Big South history. In just 15 career games, Brown has caught 36 career passes for 760 yards -- a 21.11 career yards per catch average -- and eight scores.

BIG BROWN

Charleston Southern junior LB **SOLOMON BROWN** has recorded 29.0 TFL and 11.5 sacks in his two-plus seasons in the Big South. He needs 2.5 sacks to equal the conference linebacker sack record of 14.0, which is held by **MAURICE SIMPKINS** (Coastal Carolina, 2003-05), and is 1.0 TFL shy of becoming the 18th player in league annals with 30.

50-50 RAFFLE

For the first time as Big South members, Charleston Southern scored at least 50 points in back-to-back games. The Buccaneers scored 66 points in Week 4 against Point, followed by 58 points vs. Mississippi Valley State in Week 5. It was the 11th different time a Big South team posted back-to-back 50-point games.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

Charleston Southern rushed for more than 300 yards in consecutive games for the first time during the Buccaneers' Big South tenure (since 2002). In Week 4, the Bucs gained 320 against Point and followed with 359 vs. Mississippi Valley State in Week 5. The last Big South member to post back-to-back games with 300 rushing yards was Kennesaw State last season.

MAD MAX

Gardner-Webb QB **TYRELL MAXWELL** posted his ninth career game with 100 yards rushing and 100 yards passing this past Saturday against Shorter to extend his Big South career record. He finished with 148 yards on the ground and 144 through the air against the Hawks. It was Maxwell's 10th career 100-yard rushing game -- tied for the eighth-most by any Big South player.

BIG SOUTH COLLECTS FIRST-EVER WIN OVER POWER 5 MEMBER

The Big South scored its sixth win over an FBS opponent with Liberty's 48-45 triumph over Big 12 member Baylor in Week 1. It was the conference's first-ever win over a Power 5 member, as well as the league's first FBS victory in a season-opener. The Big South's six FBS wins have all come since 2010.

CALVERT GETS BIG SOUTH PASSING RECORD TRIFECTA IN BAYLOR WIN

Liberty sophomore QB **STEPHEN CALVERT** set three Big South single-game passing records during the Flames' Week 1 win at Baylor. He established new marks for completions (44), attempts (60) and yardage (447) against the Bears. Calvert's effort bested the previous records of 37 completions (Presbyterian's **TIM WEBB** at Wofford in 2008), 57 attempts (Webb at Appalachian State in 2008) and 430 yards (Gardner-Webb's **LUCAS BEATTY** at VMI in 2014). Calvert's 447 yards of offense at Baylor is the fourth-most in a game in Big South history.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN, KENNESAW STATE TIE FOR TOP PRESEASON SPOT

For the first time, two teams finished as the favorite in the annual Big South preseason football poll, as two-time defending conference champion Charleston Southern University and third-year program Kennesaw State University claimed the top spot in the 2017 preseason rankings as voted by the league's head coaches and media panel. Both teams received nine first-place votes, eight second-place votes and one third-place vote to finish atop the poll with 80 points each. The Owls will host the Buccaneers on Saturday, Nov. 11.

GOOD WORK YOUNG MEN

The Big South Conference was once again represented among the national candidates for the All-state AFCA Good Works Team®, as Kennesaw State's **LUTHER JONES** and Liberty's **TREY TURNER** were among the 146 candidates from every subdivision and classification. The Big South has had one honoree named to the team -- Charleston Southern's **JORDAN LANCASTER** in 2010.

HELLOS

The Big South football membership will feature the addition of Campbell University in 2018, as the school announced on Nov. 14, 2016, that it will begin scholarship football that season, and make the subsequent move to the Big South. Campbell is already a full-time conference member, and is playing its final season of non-scholarship football in the Pioneer Football League. Meanwhile, the University of North Alabama will join Big South Football in 2019 as an associate member, a direct result of the Big South's collaboration agreement with the ASUN Conference in which ASUN members playing scholarship football have an automatic home in the Big South.

GOOD-BYES

Liberty University is playing its final football season in the Big South this fall, as the Flames received a waiver from the NCAA to transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision as an independent. With Liberty's transition underway, the Flames are ineligible for the Big South championship and FCS Playoffs, and thus are not eligible for the conference's preseason poll nor the FCS Coaches Top 25 poll. The Flames remain a part of the conference schedule this season and will be considered a league opponent, but will be listed at the bottom of the standings.

* At Indiana this past Saturday, it was the first time this year that CSU allowed a field goal on the opponents' opening possession. The Bucs' defense had previously gone TD, missed FG, fumble, and punt in the first four games of 2017.

* Weather played a factor in the second half at Indiana as a torrential downpour settled over the field midway through the third quarter.

* CSU did not complete a pass in the contest and was held without a passing yard in a game for the first time since the 1992 season when the Bucs had zero yards passing against Methodist.

* Freshman **SEKWAN JENKINS** notched his third takeaway of the season as he scooped up a fumble midway through the first quarter. Jenkins entered the contest with two interceptions.

* DL **ANTHONY ELLIS** recorded his second interception of the season as he caught a deflection off of **SHADARIUS HOPKINS**.

* Gardner-Webb meets N.C. Central for the fifth time on Saturday. The series is tied, 2-2, with all four meetings taking place when both teams were members of NCAA Division II (1996-99).

* Each team has won twice on the other's home field. GWU's victories occurred in 1997 (20-12) and 1999 (16-0).

* QB **TYRELL MAXWELL** now owns the two longest runs by a Big South quarterback following his 83-yard TD rush against Shorter. Maxwell holds the record of 87 yards, and is the first GWU player ever to post two 80+ yard runs.

* Maxwell's 18 rushing TDs are one shy of tying the Big South record for quarterbacks.

* Gardner-Webb rushed for 418 yards this past Saturday against Shorter, the second-most in program history at the senior college level (since 1970). It was just the third 400-yard rushing performance in program history.

* TE **JACKSON GOODMAN** caught the first touchdown of his career, a 42-yarder, in the second quarter vs. Shorter. The fifth-year senior had two catches on the day, with both going for first downs.

* The Runnin' Bulldogs were tied with Samford for the most difficult schedule nationally in the FCS heading into the week (NCAA.com). GWU will have played four Top 25 FCS programs in four FCS games after this weekend.
