# #7/7 WOFFORD (3-0, 2-0 SoCon) AT PRESBYTERIAN (2-2)

### THE PRESBYTERIAN GAME

Wofford will remain in non-conference play on Saturday as they make the short trip to Presbyterian College ... The Terriers enter the game 3-0 overall and 2-0 in the Southern Conference after a pair of one-point wins over Furman and Mercer and a three-point win over Gardner-Webb last Saturday ... Wofford and Presbyterian last met in 2013, a 55-14 win by the Terriers in Spartanburg ... The series dates back to 1914 and is tied at 40-40-3, with Wofford winning the last five meetings ... Presbyterian is 2-2 on the season after a 27-20 win over Cumberland on Saturday night, along with a win over Campbell and losses to The Citadel and Wake Forest ... Last season they were 2-9 overall and 1-4 in the Big South ... Wofford is looking for a return to the FCS Playoffs after reaching the quarterfinals last season with a 10-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in the Southern Conference ... Wofford is ranked 7th in the STATS FCS poll and 7th in the FCS Coaches poll.

### TERRIER TOP TEN

Here are the top ten notes of interest heading into the Presbyterian game:

- The contest will be between two of the three smallest schools in NCAA Division I - Wofford (1,650) and Presbyterian (1,100).
- The Terriers finished fourth in the nation in 2016 with 279.6 rushing yards per game.
- Mike Ayers has 200 wins at Wofford in his 30th season and 211 career wins in 33 seasons overall as a head coach.
- Wofford was picked to finish first in the Southern Conference preseason voting for the first time.
- Eight players received Preseason All-Southern Conference honors, with five on the first team and three on the second team.
- The offensive line was first in the country with only three total sacks and 0.21 sacks allowed in 2016.
- In the fourth quarter, Wofford outscored opponents 128 to 48 last season.
- The Terriers black shirts were 11th in the nation in rushing defense, sixth in scoring defense and fifth in total defense.
- Three different players have earned SoCon Player of the Week honors so far this season.
- The Wofford defense has allowed just two 100+ yard rushers in the last 42 games.

# THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ...

## PC'S LAST GAME

With the game tied at 20 late in the fourth quarter, Presbyterian College wide receiver DaShawn Davis rushed 49 yards for a touchdown with just 2:40 left in the contest, as PC pulled off a second-half comeback to beat Cumberland, 27-20, on Saturday night at Bailey Memorial Stadium. The Blue Hose improve to 2-2 on the year, while handing the Phoenix its first loss at 4-1.

PC got on the board first for the first with Mark Robinson scoring on a one-yard run. Cumberland answered on a three-yard run by Dezmon Huntley. On its second possession of the game, Torrance Marable found the endzone on an 11-yard pass from Ben Cheek to push the lead to 14-7. After a missed field goal attempt by Cumberland, PC added a 28-yard field goal by Brett Norton to make a 17-7 advantage.

Cumberland responded out of halftime, with a 21-yard touchdown run by Huntley and a six-yard touchdown run by Kendall Johnson to put the Phoenix in front, 20-17. PC answered with a career-long 47-yard field goal by Norton to make it 20-20 with 4:20 left in the third quarter. The decisive score in the game wouldn't come until late in the fourth quarter. DaShawn Davis took the ball on the sweep and went 49 yards for the score to put the Blue Hose in front, 27-20.

## LAST MEETING

### PRESBYTERIAN 14, #15 WOFFORD 55

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – On October 5, 2013, Wofford defeated Presbyterian College 55-14 at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers ran for a season-high 411 yards while the defense held the Blue Hose to only 187 total yards on the day.

The Terriers move to 3-2 and Presbyterian is 1-4 overall. Wofford had eight different players score touchdowns in the contest. The team was led by Donovan Johnson with 98 rushing yards and a touchdown, while quarterback Evan Jacks ran for 70 yards and had 63 yards passing in his first career start. The Blue Hose were led by Blake Roberts with 50 yards and a touchdown.

After a second Blue Hose punt, the Terriers took over at the 19-yard line and put together a drive that ended with a four-yard touchdown run by Jonny Martin. Wofford had a 7-0 lead at the 1:56 mark of the first quarter. Presbyterian was forced three-and-out and punted. Evan Jacks reached the ball over the pile on fourth-and-one from the one to take a 14-0 lead with 12:09 on the clock in the second quarter.

On the next drive for Presbyterian, they gained one first down before punting back to the Terriers. Michael Weimer fumbled and it was recovered by Joaquin Ross. Kaleb Griffin completed a nine-yard pass to Joey Gilky for a touchdown. The score was 14-7 at the 7:33 mark of the second quarter. Wofford took over and Ray Smith added a 31-yard run before Caleb Lucas scored from two-yards out for a 21-7 lead with 5:41 left in the first half. Wofford added to the lead when Michael Weimer found Will Irwin in the endzone from 29-yards out. The PAT was wide left for a 27-7 score with 3:41 remaining in the first half.

To start the second half, Wofford scored with a four-yard touchdown run by Will Gay. After another Presbyterian punt, Wofford scored on a two-yard run by Donovan Johnson for a 41-7 lead with 2:25 left in the third quarter. The Blue Hose gained a first down, but Mike McCrimon picked off a pass that was tipped by the intended receiver. With the ball back, Wofford had a fourth-and-two but fumbled on the play. Presbyterian quarterback Kaleb Griffin was picked off by Hunter Thurlley, who returned it 36-yards for a touchdown. Wofford led 48-7 at 14:06 in the fourth quarter. After trading punts, Presbyterian took over with nine minutes left in the game. Tamyn Garrick was intercepted by Brion Anderson, who returned the ball to the 22-yard line. Lorenzo Long ran 22-yards up the middle for a touchdown as Wofford took a 55-7 lead with 8:13 left in the game. Presbyterian then scored on a 12-play drive which was capped by a Blake Roberts 3-yard run. The score was 55-14 with 1:30 on the clock. Wofford ran out the clock to end the contest.

## ABOUT WOFFORD

The Terriers return a total of six starters on offense and eight starters on defense, along with one specialist ... Quarterback Brandon Goodson started 10 games and was 41-of-88 passing, along with 361 rushing yards ... Joe Newman played in five games and had two touchdowns ... Blake Morgan is the leading returning running back with 274 yards on 25 carries last year ... Tight end Chandler Gouger is the top returning receiver with 13 catches for 205 yards, while Jason Hill added eleven catches at the wide receiver spot ... Datavious Wilson (99 tackles) is the leading returning tackler, while Tyler Vaughn led the team with 17.5 tackles for loss and eight sacks last season ... Devin Watson had three interceptions in twelve starts at cornerback ... Luke Carter takes over at kicker and punter this season.

## INJURY REPORT

Freshman running back Kent Phelps (shoulder) and freshman defensive back Omari Johnson (knee) will miss the season.

## ON THIS DATE

The last time the Terriers played on September 30 was in 2000, a 35-21 home loss to Furman. Wofford and PC have met several times on September 30, including a 21-20 win by Wofford in 1995. Other games include a 28-23 win by Wofford in 1972, a 24-22 loss in Clinton in 1989, and a 20-7 road loss in 1967.

## WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

On Saturday afternoon, Wofford was able to overcome mistakes to take a 27-24 win over Gardner-Webb at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers had two turnovers and had four penalties, including two that negated touchdowns. Wofford opens the season 3-0 overall, while the Runnin' Bulldogs are 0-4 on the season. The Terriers were led by Andre Stoddard with 91 yards on 16 carries and a pair of touchdowns. Brandon Goodson was 8-of-12 passing for 117 yards and a touchdown. R.J. Taylor had three catches for 72 yards and a touchdown. Gardner-Webb quarterback Tyrell Maxwell had eight carries for 44 yards and competed 20-of-29 passes for 171 yards and two touchdowns. Wofford had 372 total yards, with 235 rushing. Gardner-Webb had 270 total yards, 161 of which were passing. Wofford had a 19 to 17 advantage in first downs. Wofford was 8-of-14 on third downs. Gardner-Webb was 5-of-12 on third down and 1-of-1 on fourth down. Both teams were called for four penalties each. Wofford had a 31:12 to 28:48 time of possession advantage.

## WOFFORD VS. GARDNER-WEBB NOTES

Coach Mike Ayers reached win number 200 at Wofford (210 total). He is now 200-134-1 with the Terriers ... Wofford has won three straight to open a season for the first time since 2012 (five straight) ... Coming off the bye week the Terriers are now 7-3 in the last ten seasons ... The 30-yard catch by R.J. Taylor in the second quarter was his first career touchdown reception ... George Gbese's interception in the third quarter was his first of the season and first in his career ... Jireh Wilson led the team with seven tackles. The Terriers had a sack by Mikel Horton and five tackles for loss ... Game captains were Jared Jacon-Duffy, Lennox McAfee, Miles Brown and Datavious Wilson.

## 2016 SEASON RECAP

The Wofford football team saw a remarkable season come to an end in the NCAA FCS playoff quarterfinals in a thrilling 30-23 double overtime loss at Youngstown State ... The Terriers took a lead with 9:22 left in the game, but a field goal by the Penguins tied it with five minutes remaining ... Both teams failed to score in the first overtime and Wofford could not answer a touchdown by YSU in the second overtime ... The Penguins added a win at Eastern Washington before falling 28-14 to James Madison in the National Championship game ... To reach the quarterfinals, Wofford defeated Charleston Southern 15-14 in the first round in Spartanburg and then picked up a 17-3 win at #6 seed The Citadel on December 3 ... It marked the seventh season the Terriers reached the NCAA FCS Playoffs and the first since 2012 ... Wofford ended the season 10-4 overall and 6-2 in SoCon to finish tied for second ... The team reached the double-digit win mark for only the

fifth time in school history ... In the national stats, Wofford finished first in net punting and first in sacks allowed ... The Terriers were fourth in the nation in rushing offense, 122nd in passing and 89th in total offense ... They were 11th in rushing defense, 22nd in passing defense and fifth in total defense ... Wofford was unranked to begin the season, but in the final polls was ranked #9 by STATS and #11 by the FCS Coaches.

## THE 2017 RETURNERS

Wofford welcomes back 15 starters from the 2016 season. On offense, the six players include offensive linemen Ross Demmel, Jared Jacon-Duffy and Roo Daniels, wide receiver R.J. Taylor, and quarterback Brandon Goodson. On defense, the eight returners are defensive linemen Miles Brown, Mikel Horton and Tyler Vaughn, safety Malik Rivera, cornerbacks Devin Watson and George Gbese, plus linebackers Terrance Morris and Datavious Wilson. In addition, long snapper Ross Hammond returns. An additional ten players who started at least one game also return.

## 2016 ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

Wofford had eight players earn first or second team honors from the coaches or media and four players were named to the All-Freshman Team. The eight Terriers honored are the most since the 2012 season when nine players were recognized. The four named All-Freshman are the most in school history, topping the three in 2010 and 2014. Earning first team honors from the Southern Conference Coaches were RB Lorenzo Long, OL Anton Warby, DL Miles Brown, DL Tyler Vaughn, and PK David Marvin. Second team honors went to OL Roo Daniels, DB Jaleel Green and P David Marvin. DB George Gbese, DL Mikel Horton, LB Datavious Wilson and LB Jireh Wilson earned All-Freshman Team honors. In the media voting, first team honors went to RB Lorenzo Long, OL Anton Wahrby, DL Tyler Vaughn, DB Jaleel Green and David Marvin as punter and kicker. Second team recognition went to OL Roo Daniels, OL Dequan Miller and DL Miles Brown.

## PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2017 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches picked Wofford to win the league. It was the first time the Terriers have ever been the pick to win the SoCon. The Southern Conference Sports Media Association also selected Wofford first.

## PRESEASON ALL-SOCON

The Terriers had eight players recognized by the league's coaches on the 2017 Preseason All-SoCon team, with five on the first team and three on the second team. Leading the Terriers on the first team were offensive lineman Roo Daniels, defensive linemen Tyler Vaughn and Miles Brown, linebacker Datavious Wilson and cornerback Devin Watson. Second team honorees include offensive lineman Ross Demmel, cornerback George Gbese and tight end Chandler Gouger.

## PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

Defensive lineman Miles Brown was named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America second team on Monday, July 31. A junior from Cheverly, Maryland, Brown started all 14 games on the defensive line for the Terriers last season. He finished the season with 48 tackles, 12.5 tackles for loss and two sacks as he earned All-Southern Conference first team honors from the coaches and second team recognition from the media. In 2015, he was named second team All-Southern Conference and earned a spot on the league's All-Freshman Team. Brown is one of nine players from the Southern Conference to earn either first-, second- or third-team Preseason All-America honors from STATS.

The senior from Saint John's, Florida, sealed the win when he intercepted Furman's go-ahead 2-point conversion attempt with just 46 seconds left in the game. Punter/place kicker Luke Carter had an all-around impressive day for the Terriers against Furman, averaging 62.2 yards on five kickoffs and 42.2 yards on four punts. The sophomore kicker also made his first career field-goal attempt, a 44-yard strike in the second quarter, and was 3-for-3 on point-after attempts.

### SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Cornerback Devin Watson was named the Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Week for all games played Sept. 7-9. Watson had a pair of second-half interceptions and recorded three tackles in the Terriers' 28-27 win at league foe Mercer on Saturday. The junior from Gainesville, Florida, picked off his first pass midway through the third quarter and added his second of the day with just 1:52 left in the game, helping seal the win after Wofford had taken its first lead of the day, 28-27, late in the fourth quarter. The weekly honor is the first of Watson's career.

### NEW RECORDS

During the 2016 season, several new school records were set. Lorenzo Long set a new mark for carries in a single season with 294. David Marvin set new records in longest field goal (57), most field goals made (17), most field goals attempts (23), most kicking points in a season (92), most consecutive games with a field goal (10) and highest punting average (46.2 yards).

### A FEW TURNOVERS

One common denominator over the past three seasons has been turnovers. After being +7 in turnovers during the 2012 SoCon Championship season, the Terriers have been in the negative. In 2013, Wofford was -5 (24 turnovers, 19 take-aways) and in 2014 the team was -1 (12 turnovers and 11 take-aways). Last season, Wofford was -2 in the turnover column with 19 turnovers (15 fumbles lost and 4 interceptions) to 17 take-aways. In 2016, Wofford only had 14 turnovers (ten fumbles and four interceptions) and had 25 take-aways (18 interceptions, seven fumble recoveries) to be +11 (+0.79 pg) on the season.

### FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the season opener against Furman, offensive linemen Blake Jeresaty, Justus Basinger and Michael Ralph made their first career starts. Also making first career starts were FB Chase Nelson, HB Blake Morgan, HB Lennox McAfee, NT Deon Priestster, LB Jireh Wilson, LB Colton Clemons and SS Mason Alstatt.

### VETERAN CAREER STARTS

The most veteran player on the team this year is center Roo Daniels with 36 games played and 28 starts. Offensive lineman Chuck Rouse and defensive lineman Tyler Vaughn have played in 37 games each. Tight end Chandler Gouger (36), fullback Chase Nelson (33) and wide receiver R.J. Taylor (34) have also played in over 30 career games. Following Daniels in starts are offensive lineman Ross Demmel (28) and defensive lineman Miles Brown (27).

### TRUE FRESHMEN ON THE FIELD

Seven true freshmen played in the 2016 season opener at Tennessee Tech. LB Datavious Wilson started at linebacker. Other true freshmen on the field included RB Ostin McPherson, RB Blake Morgan, LB Jireh Wilson, DL Mikel Horton, CB Dimitri Redwood, and WR Dorian Lindsey. Additional true freshmen playing last season were S Mason Alstatt, QB Joe Newman and DL Robbie Armstrong. Fifteen true freshman played during the 2015 season, a number matched in 2016. In 2017, true freshmen on the field in the opener included NT Deon Priestster (starter), LB Ryan Titus, DL Austin Lufkin, DL Josh Contee, LB Joe Beckett and TE Garrison Moore. John Beckley, Evan Suggs and Donovan Anderson have also played this season.

### IN THE SMOKEHOUSE

A number of freshman were redshirted in 2016, or in the words of Coach Ayers, spending some time in the smokehouse. These include OL Ronnie Brooks, LB Brandon Brown, OL Josh Burger, RB Jamison Chapman, OL Blake Jeresaty, DB Darron Paschal, RB Andy Riazzi, and DB Ulysses Strawter.

### COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Nick Colvin was named to the 2016 CoSIDA Academic All-District Football Team, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances athletically and in the classroom. He was a biology major with a 3.78 grade point average and is attending dental school at the University of North Carolina following graduation. It was the 17th straight season at least one Wofford football student-athlete has been named Academic All-District.

### 2017 RECRUITING CLASS

Wofford welcomed a total of 19 student-athletes in the 2017 recruiting class. The class includes eight players on defense and ten players on offense, in addition to one kicker. The student-athletes are from nine different states, including eight from South Carolina and two each from North Carolina, Ohio and Kentucky. On defense, the eight players include three linebackers, three linemen and two defensive backs. On offense, the ten players include five offensive linemen, three running backs, one tight end and one transfer quarterback. One kicker is also included in the class. They are joined by seven walk-ons.

### DEEP THOUGHTS...

The Terriers are one of 15 teams that are still undefeated at the FCS level ... Brandon Goodson threw for 117 yards against Gardner-Webb, the first 100+ passing game of the season for Wofford. In 2016 Wofford threw for 100 or more yards in three games ... By quarter, the Terriers are being outscored in the first quarter, but outscoring the opponents in the third and fourth quarters ... In the second half, Wofford has a 45 to 33 advantage ... Last season the Terriers outscored opponents in all four quarters; however in the second half Wofford had a 210 to 104 advantage in scoring ... Of the 13 scoring drives, four have been for 10 or more plays, while five covered 70 yards or more and four took over five minutes off the clock ... The Terriers have an average start of the 32.4 yard line, while opponents have a 30.3 yard line average start ... Ten of Lennox McAfee's 38 rushes have been for a first down or touchdown ... Wofford has three rushes on fourth down, with two resulting in a touchdown and one first down ... Blake Morgan leads the team with three plays of 20 or more yards ... Seven different players have plays of 20 or more yards ... Of the 23 catches this season, 15 have been for a first down or touchdown.

### PLAYER INTEREST NOTES

S Devin Watson is cousins with Houston Texans QB Deshaun Watson, however they were never on the field at the same time in Clemson game in 2015 ... CB George Gbese (Ghana) is the lone foreign born players on the roster ... S Graham Massey's twin brother Reed is an infielder on the Wofford baseball team ... LB Rob Saylor's twin sister plays lacrosse at Wofford ... RB Ellis Pace is among the walk-ons who earned a scholarship ... S Michael Sarafianos filled in at kicker as a freshman when David Marvin missed several games due to injury ... K Luke Carter's father is the president of Francis Marion University ... LS Ross Hammond's father is serving as South Carolina Secretary of State ... DL Miles Brown went to high school at Sidwell Friends, where he was classmates with former President Obama's daughters ... QB Brandon Goodson spent the summer of 2016 as an intern at the Aspen Institute in Colorado ... FB Chase Nelson worked for Robins & Morton this summer on the construction of the Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium ... Over 85 players spent time this season on campus and in addition to taking classes, took part in a variety of internships and jobs. ### WOFFORD 100 YARD RUSHERS

Wofford began 2016 with a 100-yard game from Will Gay against Tennessee Tech and added 100-yard games from Lorenzo Long against JCSU, ETSU, Samford, Western Carolina, The Citadel,

Mercer, Chattanooga and VMI. Brandon Goodson had his first 100-yard game at Furman and Joe Newman had 125 yards against Youngstown State. Wofford had a 100-yard rusher in eleven of the 14 games. Wofford is still looking for the first 100+ yard rusher this season. Lennox McAfee was close with 99 at Mercer.

### OPPONENT 100 YARD RUSHERS

The Wofford rushing defense ended the 2014 season ranked ninth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 1,182 total yards on 392 carries for an average of 107.5 yards per game. A big part of that defense was not allowing an opponent to have a 100+ yard rusher. The Terriers went 17 games without allowing a 100+ rusher (last 2 games in 2013, 11 games in 2014, first four games in 2015) before allowing Tee Mitchell to go for 110 yards at Mercer on October 3. The previous 100+ rusher was Jacob Huesman of Chattanooga on November 9, 2013 with 116 yards on 18 carries. Wofford then went 19 games straight without a 100-yard rusher, which ended when Youngstown State's Jody Webb had 213 rushing yards in the NCAA FCS Quarterfinals. He was the first 200-yard rusher allowed since 2009.

### UNDER 100 YARDS RUSHING

Wofford held opponents to under 100 total rushing yards three times in 2015 - Gardner-Webb (91), Western Carolina (89) and VMI (46). In nine of the 14 games in 2016, the Terriers held opponents to under 100 rushing yards. Wofford started 2016 by holding Tennessee Tech to 41 rushing yards and then Ole Miss ran for 174 yards. JCSU gained only 18 total yards and ETSU was at -7 for the game, while Samford ran for only 30 yards and Western Carolina had 46. The nation's top rushing team, The Citadel, was held to 190 rushing yards (down from the 381 average) and did not allow a 100-yard rusher. Mercer was held to 48 rushing yards, Furman ran for 65, Chattanooga had 88 and VMI had 62. Youngstown State had 240 in the playoffs, the most by an opponent last season.

### A LITTLE MORE PASSING

In 2012, Wofford ran 854 total plays. Of those plays, 766 were rushing and 88 were pass attempts (89.7% rush offense). In the 2013 season, the Terriers ran 784 plays, 647 of which were runs and 137 pass attempts. The rush offense was down to 82.5%, or conversely the passing offense was up seven percent. In 2014, of the 688 total plays, 575 were runs and 113 were passes for a 83.6% rush offense. During the 2015 season, Wofford had 106 passes and 633 rushes for a 85.6% rushing offense. Last season the Terriers had 785 rushing attempts and 123 passes for a 86.4% run offense.

### LESS PASSING, MORE WINS

Since the start of the 2010 season, the Terriers have been most successful when they throw the ball ten times or less in a game. With ten or fewer attempts, Wofford is 37-18 overall. With eleven or more passes per game, Wofford is 19-14 overall.

### THE RED ZONE

The Wofford red zone offense was 41-of-51 overall with 32 touchdowns and nine field goals for a 80.4% success rate which was 61st in the nation. The red zone defense was even more impressive,

ranking first in the Southern Conference and seventh in the nation at 70.5%. The Terriers opponents were 31-of-44 in the red zone with 27 touchdowns and four field goals.

### FOURTH DOWN? GO FOR IT!

On fourth and short in plus territory, expect the Terriers to go for it instead of punting. Wofford was 20-of-34 on fourth downs, while opponents were 9-of-18. The Terriers were 28th in the nation in fourth down percentage with a 58.8% success rate and were second in fourth down attempts. Defensively, opponents were only at 50% on the season to ranked 56th in the nation. So far this season the Terriers are 4-of-5 on fourth down.

### COACHING STABILITY AT THE TOP

With Mike Ayers in his 30th season on the sidelines at Wofford, some of his assistants have also put in a number of years. Offensive coordinator Wade Lang leads the way at 30 years on staff. Offensive line coach Eric Nash has 15 years of experience at Wofford. Overall, the assistant coaches have 86 years of combined service at Wofford. In addition, six of the ten assistant coaches are Wofford graduates.

### COACHING CHANGES

During the 2017 offseason, the Terriers welcomed two new coaches to the staff. Jon Wheeler (Wofford '05) works with the outside linebackers and Rob Greene (Wofford '14) will coach the cornerbacks. Shiel Wood (Wofford '06) also added the role of defensive coordinator after the departure of Nate Fuqua.

### WINNING SEASONS

With a 9-4 mark in 2012, Wofford had a winning record for the third straight season and the tenth time in the last eleven years in 2012. The Terriers were 5-6 in 2013, one game under the .500 mark, but rebounded with a 6-5 record in 2014. Wofford was 5-6 in 2015, but were 10-4 in 2016 to secure a winning record. Over the past twenty-nine seasons under Coach Ayers, Wofford has recorded 20 winning seasons.

### POLL POSITIONS

The Terriers opened the 2013 season ranked #5 by the coaches and #8 by The Sports Network (now STATS), but dropped out on November 18. To begin 2014, they were receiving votes in both polls but failed to garner votes in the final poll. Wofford opened 2015 failing to receive votes in either major poll. In the 2016 preseason polls, Wofford received votes in both polls. Following the win over Chattanooga, Wofford returned to the top 25 on November 14, sitting at #19 in the FCS Coaches poll and #20 in the STATS FCS poll. In the final poll, Wofford was #11 in the Coaches Poll and #9 in the STATS poll. The Terriers begin the 2017 season ranked #11 in both polls and are now 9th.

### TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

The 2017 season marks the 20th time in the last 21 seasons the Terriers have played against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-18 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7

## HEAD COACH MIKE AYERS • 30TH SEASON

Wofford head coach Mike Ayers (Georgetown, Ky. '74), the winningest coach in school history, is in his 30th season at the Terrier helm with a record of 197-136-1. Ayers has spent 33 years as a collegiate head coach and has a record of 208-157-2 that includes a three-year stint as the head coach at East Tennessee State from 1985-87. Ayers earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors from the league coaches in 2000, 2003 and 2007 and by the media in 2000, '02, '03 and '10. Ayers was the 2003 recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award as Division I-AA's National Coach of the Year and also earned the 2002 Division I-AA National Coach of the Year award from the *College Sporting News* in addition to being the runner-up for the Robinson Award. Ayers is the longest tenured coach in the Southern Conference at 30 years, with Mark Speir at Western Carolina next at six seasons.

### WINNINGEST ACTIVE FCS COACHES

Head coach Mike Ayers has 208 wins (197 Wofford, 11 ETSU) which ranks tied for third in the FCS among active coaches entering the 2017 season.

at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2016, Wofford lost to Ole Miss, while South Carolina (2017) and Wyoming (2018) are also on future schedules.

### DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense is a true team with contributions from numerous players in 2016. Overall, 22 players recorded ten or more tackles. 26 players had at least a share of a tackle for loss, while 12 recorded sacks. Nine players had interceptions, seven had fumble recoveries and six had forced fumbles.

### GOING OVERTIME

The overtime game against Youngstown State was only the ninth overtime game in school history. The Terriers lost the first two overtime games, then won the next two against Western Carolina and Georgia Southern. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. After the win over Mercer in 2015 and losses to The Citadel and Youngstown State (double overtime) in 2016, Wofford is now 4-5 all-time in overtime games.

### TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 65 of its last 83 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 86-32 (.743) ... Under Mike Ayers, Wofford is 94-45 (.674) in home games ... The Terriers have won 50 of 75 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

### THE 2016 TERRIERS GROUND ATTACK

Wofford finished last season ranked fourth in the nation in rushing at 300.2 yards per game. This season, Wofford finished at 279.6 rushing yards per game to rank fourth in the nation.

### ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) in eight of the last ten seasons to earn public recognition. In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 146 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Among all NCAA Division I (FBS and FCS) football teams, Wofford's APR score of 986 is 18th in the nation. The Terriers are ahead of schools such as Richmond (985), Stanford (983), Princeton (983), Navy (982), Boston College (981), Harvard (979), Virginia (974), and Wake Forest (968).

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/Capital One First Team All-District in each of the last 17 seasons. In 2016 Nick Colvin was named Academic All-District. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

### PREVENTING THE SACK

The offensive line was a veteran group this season, with two seniors, a junior and a pair of sophomores in the starting five. Last year they gave up only eight sacks all season which ranked third in the nation (0.73 per game). In 2016 they allowed just one sack each against Johnson C. Smith, ETSU and Samford to lead the nation.

### DROPPING THE QB

While the offensive line prevents sacks, the defensive line made them with 31 in the 2016 season for a loss of 200 yards to rank fourth in the SoCon and 48th in the nation. In addition, the Terriers had 95 tackles for a loss of 355 yards which is third in the conference and 27th in the nation. Last season Wofford had 18 sacks (+12) and 49 tackles for loss (+46).

### RUSHING LEGACY

Wofford has finished among the top seven schools in the nation in rushing in each of the past 20 years. The Terriers' wingbone offense puts a premium on ball control and keeping the opponent's offense on the boundary. Eight times the Terriers have been second in the nation in rushing yards per game, while in 2010 and 2011 they finished first.

### WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE

#### OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 23-3 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... The loss to Gardner-Webb in 2013 ended a nine-game streak and Wofford lost again to Gardner-Webb in 2014.

### BRENTON BERSIN

Wide receiver Brenton Bersin ('12) signed as an undrafted free agent with the Carolina Panthers in April of 2012. He spent the 2013 season on the Panthers practice squad. He re-signed with the Panthers again in 2014 and made the 53-man roster and had his first NFL catch against Detroit on September 14. He caught his first touchdown on October 19 at Green Bay and made his first start on October 26 against Seattle. Bersin's 1-yard touchdown reception at Green Bay was the first touchdown catch by a player from Wofford since Jerry Richardson had a touchdown as a member of the Baltimore Colts at Dallas (10/30/60). In 2015, Bersin had a career-high four catches against Tampa Bay (10/4). He remained on the roster for the remainder of the season as the Panthers won the NFC Championship and played in Super Bowl 50. He was on the active roster for the 2016 season but reached an injury settlement following training camp in 2017.

### KASEY REDFERN

Punter Kasey Redfern ('14) made the 53-man roster for the Detroit Lions and kicked in the opener against Arizona. However he suffered a knee injury and was placed on injured reserve. He joined the Lions as a free agent after most recently spending time with the Cleveland Browns. He spent time on the Chargers practice squad in 2015 before joining the Carolina Panthers during the 2016 preseason and was traded to the Browns. He entered the NFL as an undrafted rookie free agent.

**MR. RICHARDSON**

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid-1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241 receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Richardson calls his greatest honor being elected team captain in 1958. In 1983, he was chosen to Wofford's All-Time Football team as a receiver. He is currently the owner of the Carolina Panthers. In 2015, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. The Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts opened in the spring of 2017 and is the home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. The Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium is a 123,000-square-foot facility that opens in September and includes a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 400-seat volleyball competition venue.

**CAROLINA PANTHER TRAINING CAMP**

The Carolina Panthers have held summer training camp at Wofford since their inaugural season in 1995 and it will be held on campus until at least 2019. The camp provides Wofford tremendous national exposure and visibility. Media members that visit Wofford during the camp include ESPN, Fox Sports, NFL Network, USA Today and Sports Illustrated. Last year's camp drew a record crowd of nearly 135,400 visitors, while in 2017 the camp drew 99,196 visitors to campus.



**RECENT SUCCESS**

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in twelve of the last thirteen years, winning four SoCon Championships. In the last 13+ years, the Terriers have won 64 of 100 SoCon games played. Over that time, Wofford is the winningest program in the Southern Conference with a .636 win percentage.

The Terriers were led by Lennox McAfee with 67 rushing yards and a touchdown, while Andre Stoddard had 64 rushing yards and a touchdown. The Paladins were led by Thomas Gordon with five catches for 107 yards, while P.J. Blaziejowski was 13-of-24 passing for 224 yards.

The Terriers had the ball to open the game. After two first downs and a conversion of a fourth-and-two, Andre Stoddard scored from 16-yards out for a 7-0 lead at the 9:33 mark. On the first drive by the Paladins, a 20-yard field goal made it a 7-3 game at 4:24 in the first quarter. With the ball back, Luke Carter made a 44-yard field goal for a 10-3 lead at the 12:27 mark of the second quarter.

Furman had a pair of passing first downs to move across midfield. A 30-yard reception by Thomas Gordon gave the Paladins first down at the five. Antonio Wilcox capped the drive with a two-yard touchdown to tie the game at 10-10 with 8:04 left in the second quarter. After a Wofford three-and-out, Furman began on the Terriers 46-yard line. A holding penalty negated a touchdown and then a 33-yard field goal was wide right. The Terriers took over with 2:46 left in the first half. Penalties again prevented the Wofford offense from gaining ground and a three-and-out forced a punt with ninety seconds remaining in the half. The Terriers forced a three-and-out and took over with 33 second on the clock. One play ran out the first half with the score tied at 10.

On the opening drive of the second half, Furman went 75 yards in eight plays and scored on a four yard run by P.J. Blaziejowski. With 11:55 on the clock in the third quarter, the Paladins had a 17-10 lead. Wofford went three-and-out and punted on the ensuing drive. Furman then had one first down before punting back to the Terriers. Wofford gained three first downs before having to punt.

After a Furman three-and-out, Wofford had a first down on a pass interference call. Following another first down, the Terriers were faced with a fourth-and-one. Lennox McAfee scored from 15 yards out to tie the game at 17 with 13:53 left in the fourth quarter. Furman had one first down before punting. Wofford had four first downs and had the ball inside the 20-yard line when Chase Nelson fumbled and the ball was recovered by the Paladins at the 10-yard line.

The Wofford defense forced a three-and-out. After the punt, the Terriers took over at the Paladins' 43-yard line. A reception by R.J. Taylor and run by Blake Morgan moved Wofford inside the 20-yard line. A run by Lennox McAfee gave the Terriers first and goal at the two. A one-yard touchdown by Chase Nelson with 2:46 remaining gave Wofford a 24-17 lead. Furman had two first downs before Triston Luke went down the far sideline for a 44-yard touchdown. The two point conversion attempt was intercepted by Malik Rivera and Wofford had a 24-23 lead with 46 seconds remaining. The Terriers ran two plays to run out the clock on the victory.

MACON, Ga. — Down 13 points with nine minutes left in the game, Wofford rallied for a 28-27 win at Mercer on Saturday afternoon at Five Star Stadium. The Terriers scored touchdowns at the 6:18 and 3:34 marks of the fourth quarter and intercepted Mercer twice in the final two minutes for the win.

Wofford opens the season 2-0 overall and in the Southern Conference, while the Bears are 1-1 on the season and 0-1 in league play. The Terriers were led by Lennox McAfee with 99 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries, while Blake Morgan and Andre Stoddard added rushing touchdowns. The defense came up with three interceptions and one fumble recovery. The Bears were led by Avery Ward with 113 receiving yards and Kaelan Riley was 14-of-28 passing for 167 yards.

The Bears returned the opening kickoff 91 yards to the eight-yard line. A seven yard catch by Marquise Irvin gave Mercer a 7-0 lead. Wofford gained one first down before punting. With the ball back, the Bears capped the drive with a 15-yard touchdown reception by Avery Ward for a 14-0 lead. The Terriers had one first down on their next possession, but were forced to punt.

Mercer went three and out. After two first downs, Lennox McAfee went 33-yards down the far sideline for a touchdown. Wofford trailed 14-7 at 14:14 in the second quarter. The Bears gained three first downs before punting. After the teams traded punts, the Bears went for a deep pass on the first play but it was dropped. A three-and-out gave the Terriers the ball at the 25-yard line after the punt. A holding penalty on the first play of the drive by Wofford could not be overcome and the Terriers punted. Kaelan Riley capped the Mercer drive with a one-yard run for a 21-7 lead with 21 seconds left in the first half. The Terriers gained one first down before the half ended.

The Terriers had the ball to open the second half and Lennox McAfee went 57 yards down the near sideline for the touchdown for a 21-14 game. After trading punts, the Bears took over at the 26-yard line but Devin Watson picked off a wobbly pass and Wofford took over at the 24-yard line. On fourth-and-goal from the one, a pass was broken up in the end zone to end the scoring chance.

The Bears added points on a 32-yard field goal to take a 24-14 lead with 14:19 left in the fourth quarter. Deep in their own territory, the Terriers converted a fourth-and-two with a reception by R.J. Taylor. Back-to-back sacks forced Wofford to punt. The Bears returned the punt 51 yards and began the drive at the 26 yard line. They put three points on the board with a 34-yard field goal for a 27-14 advantage with 8:15 remaining.

With the ball back, Blake Morgan then caught a 46-yard pass to move across midfield and Andre Stoddard found the end zone from ten yards out to cut the lead to 27-21 with 6:18 left on the clock. The Bears completed a pass, but the ball was stripped by George Gbese and Wofford took over at the 29-yard line. On fourth-and-goal from the two, Blake Morgan dove at the pylon for a touchdown. Wofford took a 28-27 lead with 3:34 on the clock.

On a long pass by Mercer, Devin Watson got inside the receiver for his second interception of the day. The Terriers were unable to gain a first down and Mercer used their remaining timeouts on the drive, giving the Bears the ball with 1:25 left. After a sack, Terrance Morris made a diving interception and Wofford took over at the 38-yard line with sixty seconds remaining. One knee later the Terriers left Macon with a 28-27 victory.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. — On Saturday afternoon, the Wofford College football team was able to overcome mistakes to take a 27-24 win over Gardner-Webb at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers had two turnovers and had four penalties, including two that negated touchdowns.

Wofford opens the season 3-0 overall, while the Runnin' Bulldogs are 0-4 on the season. The Terriers were led by Andre Stoddard with 91 yards on 16 carries and a pair of touchdowns. Brandon Goodson was 8-of-12 passing for 117 yards and a touchdown. R.J. Taylor had three catches for 72 yards and a touchdown. Gardner-Webb quarterback Tyrell Maxwell had eight carries for 44 yards and competed 20-of-29 passes for 171 yards and two touchdowns.

The Terriers had the ball first and Luke Carter hit a 37-yard field goal to give Wofford a 3-0 lead at 8:11 in the first quarter. The Runnin' Bulldogs went three-and-out and Wofford took over after the punt. However the Terriers also went three-and-out and punted.

With the ball back, Gardner-Webb went three-and-out. Wofford looked to have gained a first down on a pass to Blake Morgan, but it was ruled incomplete and the Terriers punted. The Runnin' Bulldogs put together a twelve play drive that was capped by a 30-yard field goal to tie the game at 3-3 with 9:57 on the clock in the second quarter. The Terriers answered with a twelve play drive of their own that ended with a 30-yard touchdown reception by R.J. Taylor from Brandon Goodson. Wofford had a 10-3 lead at 4:40 in the second quarter.

The Runnin' Bulldogs went three-and-out and punted, with the Terriers taking over at the 43-yard line. A Wofford pitch was fumbled and picked up by Thomas Adams, who returned it 53 yards for a touchdown. The game was tied at ten with 2:39 left in the first half. With the ball back, the Terriers took seven plays to regain the lead when Andre Stoddard scored from two yards out. The Runnin' Bulldogs ran one play before the half ended with the Terriers leading 17-10.

To open the second half, the Runnin' Bulldogs had two first downs before a pass by Tyrell Maxwell was intercepted by George Gbese. Wofford's Andre Stoddard had a rushing first down and then Luke Carter hit a 32-yard field goal for a 20-10 lead at 9:40 in the third quarter. On the next drive by Gardner-Webb, they went 75 yards in 13 plays and scored on a five-yard pass to Ralph Jolly to cut the lead to 20-17 with 3:00 left in the third quarter.

Wofford had a 38-yard reception by R.J. Taylor for a first down and Andre Stoddard went up the middle 26 yards for a touchdown. The Terriers lead was 27-17 with 39 seconds left in the third quarter. The Runnin' Bulldogs had a pair of first downs before punting and Wofford took over at the five-yard line. The Terriers were unable to gain positive yardage and went three-and-out.

Taking over at the 45-yard line, the Runnin' Bulldogs scored on a 23-yard touchdown pass to Willie Jackson IV to cut the lead to 27-24 with 7:45 left in the fourth quarter. With the ball back, Wofford had a pair of first downs to move across midfield. A fumble by Andre Stoddard was recovered by Gardner-Webb with 2:35 on the clock in the fourth quarter.
